



Kenya and Tanzania possess some of Africa's finest landscapes, varied wildlife and beautiful beaches. Together they combine their natural attractions with comfortable lodges and hotels, well-organised safaris and excursions. With Tanzania's attractive beaches in Zanzibar and a visit to the lively Kenyan city of Nairobi, you can experience the thrill of an African safari combined with the modern culture of the country and the relaxation of a beautiful beach stay.

For most visitors Nairobi will be the first place to stay, before proceeding for the safari. The city was developed by 1900, when the Mombasa – Uganda Railway was built. Today, Nairobi is a lively cosmopolitan and yet, pleasantly small city with a multi-cultural atmosphere.

From the plains of the Masai Mara in Kenya to the peaks of Mount Kilimanjaro in Tanzania, East Africa's natural vegetation is as diverse as its climate and topography would suggest. Kenya and Tanzania's coasts are lined with pristine white sand beaches fringing the warm inviting waters of the Indian Ocean.

The East Africa coast is a place with a long and exotic history and its calm blue waters the traditional passage of the Arabian spice trade. In the winding mediaeval streets and bustling markets of Zanzibar Stone Town, life has continued unhurried and unchanged for hundreds of years. This blend of natural beauty and living history creates an exotic paradise unlike anywhere else on earth.

Sightseeing

Kenya's wilderness is famous worldwide. The name Kenya has become synonymous with the great wilds of Africa but they represent far more than you would ever expect, protecting and showcasing a broad range of habitats and species. Millions of wildebeest on their annual migration





and equally large numbers of pink flamingos massing on the shores of the Rift Valley soda lakes are breathtaking sights.

Tanzania's famous Serengeti National Park is well-known for its great migration. Over a million wildebeest and about 200,000 zebras flow south from the northern hills to the southern plains for the short rains every October and November and then swirl west and north after the long rains in April, May and June. The ancient instinct to move is so strong that no drought or crocodile infested river can hold them back.

Today, the Serengeti National Park, the Ngorongoro Conservation Area and the Masai Mara Game Reserve protect the greatest and most varied collection of terrestrial wildlife on earth, one of the last great migratory systems.



Masai Mara's open plains are renowned for the Big Five; Amboseli, with snow-capped Kilimanjaro as a magnificent backdrop, is home to huge herds of elephant. The Great Rift Valley's Lake Nakuru offers habitat for tens of thousands of flamingos whilst Lake Naivasha is home of the hippopotamus;



Ngorongoro Crater, a spectacular natural amphitheatre, teems with animals; Lake Manyara abounds with elephant, hippopotamus and buffalo; Tanzania's largest national park – Serengeti is a perfect backdrop to the wildebeest migration; and the marine parks' coral reefs host prolific aquatic life.

Ambient game lodges and tented camps during safaris; relaxing beach resorts in Zanzibar and comfortable city hotels in Nairobi.

Family activities

Unforgettable safaris including a cultural visit to a Masai village.

Shopping



Choosing your safari


A safari provides the unforgettable thrill of seeing animals roaming freely through some of the most spectacular scenery in the world. Emirates Holidays offers a wide selection of safaris enabling you to choose the itinerary that best suits you.

A few hints and tips

We recommend you carry neutral-coloured light clothing, comfortable shoes, a warm pullover (mornings and evenings can be quite chilly), insect repellent, camera and binoculars. Soft baggage, not exceeding 15 kilograms per person, is most practical. It is recommended that you take precautions against malaria.

General information

We offer two types of safaris – the traditional itinerary safari that combines two or more national parks or you may choose a single-centre safari, where you fly into a national park or reserve and stay at a tented camp or lodge.



Itinerary safaris In Kenya you can visit the popular Masai Mara National Reserve, known for its spectacular sights of million-strong herds of wildebeest migrating. Amboseli National Park, particularly noted for elephant and buffalo, is renowned for its superb views of the magnificent Mount Kilimaniaro. In the Great Rift Valley, Lake Nakuru National Park and Lake Naivasha offer excellent sightings of flamingos and hippopotamus respectively.



In Tanzania, Serengeti National Park contains the world's largest concentration of animals of the plains including lion, cheetah and hyena; Lake Manyara National Park is located in the stunning setting of the Great Rift Valley; and the 600-metre deep Ngorongoro Crater is home to the rare rhinoceros, elephant, lion and wildebeest.

Single-centre safaris

Single-centre safaris to popular national parks such as Kenya's Masai Mara and Tanzania's Ngorongoro Crater and Serengeti National Park feature accommodation in select lodges or tented camps.

Accommodation and meals

In Kenya, guests can stay either in permanently structured tented camps or in lodges, both providing simple accommodation with en suite bathrooms.

Game drives

There are usually two game drives a day – early morning and late afternoon – each lasting about two-and-a-half hours. Vehicles are generally four-wheel drives or microbuses with pop-up roofs.

Children

Children under six years of age are normally not permitted on game drives.







This thrilling safari takes you into four different reserves. Samburu, lying within the semi-desert area of Kenya's northern frontier, is a lava plain with dramatic, steep-sided gullies and rounded hills. Lake Nakuru's alkaline waters attract millions of flamingos that form a vivid pink ring around the shore. Mount Kenya National Park surrounds Mount Kenya. Masai Mara's open plains provide a habitat that supports teeming wildlife, where there is an excellent chance of spotting the Big Five.



This exciting safari takes you through some of Tanzania's finest reserves. Lake Manyara National Park in the Great Rift Valley abounds in elephant, hippopotamus and buffalo. The eighth wonder of the world – Ngorongoro Crater – rising high above the Serengeti plains, is a vast, natural amphitheatre rich in wildlife. The Serengeti is a magnificently vast expanse of savannah where lions, cheetahs and hyenas stalk their prey.

Day 1: Nairobi

We meet you on arrival and transfer you to your hotel. Overnight in Nairobi.

Day 2: Nairobi — Lake Manyara National Park

Depart after breakfast for Arusha via Namanga border. Arrive at your lodge in Lake Manyara National Park, nestled at the foot of the Great Rift Valley, in time for an afternoon game drive. Overnight at Lake Manyara.

Day 3: Lake Manyara National Park — Ngorongoro

Proceed on your journey through the lush, tranquil beauty of the Ngorongoro highlands. Your lodge, located on the rim of the crater, offers breathtaking views as you enjoy a stunning sunset. Overnight in Ngorongoro.



Day 4: Ngorongoro

Descend into the crater for a full day's game-viewing. Endangered black rhinoceros, cheetahs and elephants can be found here. Overnight at Ngorongoro.

Day 5: Ngorongoro — Serengeti National Park

Drive through magnificent scenery to Serengeti via Olduvai Gorge, believed to be the origin of mankind. Overnight at your lodge in Serengeti.


Day 6: Serengeti National Park


Nairobi The gateway to Africa

Nairobi – a Masai word meaning 'place of cool waters' – sprang up with the building of the Mombasa to Uganda railway. Nairobi is the only city in Africa to have a national park teeming with wildlife just eight kilometres from the city centre. The city is also the ideal starting point for a safari into the wilderness of Africa – Masai Mara.

Places of interest: Visitors can have a good game-viewing experience at Nairobi National Park, located on the outskirts of the city. Other points of interest include the National Museum and the Railway Museum.

For the family: Families can visit the Karen Blixen Museum, the adjacent Giraffe Centre and the Ostrich Park.

Best buys: Local handicrafts include African art, masks, wood, stone and ebony carvings, Masai dolls and beadwork.





Nairobi city tour

Half-day seat-in-coach excursion

Nairobi with its high altitude, healthy climate, fertile soil, attractive parks and gardens and cosmopolitan atmosphere, is today one of Africa's most appealing cities. And where else can you see lion, rhinoceros, cheetah and giraffe roaming freely against a backdrop of city towers?

During this short city tour, you will visit the **Uhuru (Freedom) Park,** which is the main centre for outdoor speech services and rallies.

As the Mombasa-Kampala railway runs to the central business district, the **Railway Station**, including the **Railway Museum** will be explored. We then visit the **Snake Park**, where visitors can view a variety of snakes, turtles and crocodiles that are only native to Africa.




The National Museum




Out of Africa

Half-day chauffeur-driven private car excursion

This excursion includes a visit to the famous **Karen Blixen Museum**, the adjacent **Giraffe Centre** and **Kazuri Centre** to witness jewellery making.

Karen Blixen Museum was originally the home of Karen Blixen, who came to Kenya from Denmark in the early part of this century. The museum house was restored by the Danish government and was used during the filming of 'Out of Africa', which immortalised Karen Blixen's book by the same name. Views of the Ngong Hills can be admired from the beautifully landscaped gardens of the museum.



Our next visit, **The Giraffe Centre**, is a wonderful and refreshing experience. The Giraffe Manor, often referred to as Africa's pride has been the focus of the international media. Its founders, Jock and Betty Leslie-Melville, rescued a baby giraffe named Daisy from a heavily-poached area of western Kenya in 1974. Since then, their home has become a household name among wildlife lovers worldwide and made Daisy a star in her own right. This tour gives a complete up close and personal interaction, where guests have the opportunity to view giraffes as well as feed them. You end the tour with a visit the jewellery making centre to see the local artisans at work.

Zanzibar

The spice island


This tiny tropical paradise on the west coast of Tanzania has much more to offer than its size would indicate. Known as The Spice Island (it was once the world's largest producer of cloves), Zanzibar was the chief port on the East African coast during the early 19th century. Today, it is the influence of the Persians and Omanis that lingers most strongly, the latter even moved the Sultan's court here from Muscat.

Places of interest: The beaches of the east coast are superb. You can explore the spice and fruit plantations and visit **Jozani Forest Nature**Reserve which is home to the last remaining colony of the red Colobus Monkey.

Best buys: The narrow winding streets of Stone Town are lined with stores selling local crafts, antiques, jewellery, clothes, books and spices.

Sporting attraction: For water sports enthusiasts, the coral reefs and open sea between Zanzibar and Pemba are justly famous for the quality of their snorkelling, scuba diving and big game fishing.


Zanzibar is still the best-kept secret in the Indian Ocean, with its fascinating historical 'Stone Town' and magnificent beaches. The history of Zanzibar would be incomplete without the cloves, nutmeg, cinnamon, pepper and many other spices which brought the Sultans of Oman and the beginnings of the infamous slave trade.

This excursion is guaranteed to awaken your senses as we go from one spice plantation to another where you will have the opportunity to pick, smell and savour fruits and spices never seen before. Your tour calls first at the site of **David Livingston's house** (one of Africa's greatest explorers) before visiting the ruins of the **Maruhubi Palace**, constructed by Sultan



Said Bargash between 1880 and 1882 as a harem to accommodate his concubines. The journey continues north of **Stone Town** towards **Kidichi Persian Baths**, decorated in floridly ornamental Persian-style stuccowork.

From here we continue to the rural areas where local farmers produce some of the world's most exotic fruits and spices – cloves, star fruit, 'bulls heart', lip-stick trees, tangerine, lemon grass, mangosteen, nutmeg, cardamom, cinnamon, pepper, turmeric, masala, chillies, ginger and dozens of others that you are unlikely to find on your local supermarket's shelves.




