
Sightseeing

Situated amidst some of the world's most outstanding coastal scenery, sheltered by mighty mountains and surrounded by fertile farmlands and extensive vineyards, Cape Town's location is undoubtedly one of the most beautiful in the world.

Dominating the landscape is Table Mountain. A must for visitors is a ride to the summit by cable car for unparalleled views of the city and coast. Also high on most travellers' list is Cape Peninsula, with the shoreline between Clifton and Kommetjie being particularly dramatic.

Nearby are the Cape Winelands. A journey along the Wine Route takes you through country that not only produces exceptional wines and offers opportunities to sample them but also possesses outstandingly beautiful pastoral landscapes.

The Garden Route, stretching from Mossel Bay to Port Elizabeth, is one of the world's most scenic journeys, taking you through amazingly varied landscapes of soaring cliffs, spectacular beaches, rocky coves, thick forests, tranquil lakes and rugged mountains. Nearly 300 species of birds are to be found in a variety of habitats along the route, whilst nature reserves embrace the varied ecosystems of the area.

Marine reserves provide a protected habitat for soft coral reefs, dolphins, seals and other marine life, including the endangered Southern Right Whale which come to calve in the winter and spring.

Kruger National Park is home to an unrivalled range of animals, including lion, leopard, cheetah, buffalo, elephant, giraffe, rhinoceros, hippopotamus and antelope. Although the largest game reserve in South Africa, it is easy to explore – there are restaurants, petrol stations, shops and rest camps.

Sun City, less than two hours' drive from Johannesburg, is one of the world's truly great resorts. Fine hotels, excellent sports facilities, the wildlife of Pilansberg National Park, a casino and superb entertainment at the Superbowl combine to make this a complete holiday destination. For sports enthusiasts, there is tennis, squash, bowling, swimming, a host of water activities at Waterworld and two Gary Player-designed golf courses, one with live crocodiles as a permanent hazard.

The Karongwe Private Game Reserve is home to a variety of indigenous African animals including elephant, lion, leopard and over 350 species of birds.

Day 6: Johannesburg (420 kilometres)





The Victoria Falls lie between Zambia and Zimbabwe in Southern Africa and are part of two national parks: Mosi-oa-Tunya National Park in Zambia and Victoria Falls National Park in Zimbabwe. Shrouded in mists and rainbows and enveloped by evergreen forests, the falls are a breathtaking sight and an unforgettable experience. There is a magic about them manifested in the towering column of spray when the river is high, the thunder of the falling water and the tranquil lagoons upstream in which hippopotamuses and crocodiles lurk. The Victoria Falls is 1,708 metres wide, making it the largest curtain of water in the world.

Cruise on the world-famous Victoria Falls for a romantic sunset cruise and walk through the rainforest and marvel at one of the natural wonders of the world.

Day 1: Arrive Victoria Falls (25 kilometres)

On arrival at Victoria Falls Airport, you will be warmly greeted and transferred to your hotel. In the afternoon enjoy a romantic sundowner cruise on the Zambezi River, above the mighty falls. We then head back to the hotel for an overnight stay.




Day 2: Victoria Falls (10 kilometres)

Depart on a morning tour to Victoria Falls. Due to its unique geography, you can watch the falls face-on and enjoy the full force of the spray, noise and spectacular rainbows that are always present. For the more adventurous, there are options for white water rafting, river boarding, bungee jumping and so much more. Overnight stay at your hotel.

Day 3: Depart Victoria Falls (25 kilometres)

Spend your last morning in the adventure capital before you are transferred back to Victoria Falls Airport for your onward journey.

Choosing your safari

With its fascinating diversity of wildlife, its variety of game lodges catering to different budgets, professional rangers and excellent infrastructure, South Africa provides a magical setting for a safari experience with three types of safari destinations – private, state-owned, or the world-renowned Kruger National Park.

A few hints and tips

We recommend you carry neutral-coloured light clothing, comfortable shoes, a warm pullover (mornings and evenings can be quite chilly), insect repellent, camera, binoculars and soft baggage not exceeding 15 kilograms per person. Malaria precautions are advisable. Children under eight years are not permitted on game drives at private game reserves and under the age of five in semi-open vehicles in Kruger National Park.

A typical safari Itinerary

At O R Tambo International Airport you will be met by one of our representatives, who will guide you to the domestic departure hall for your flight to the airport or airstrip from where it is a short drive to your chosen game reserve. On arrival, transfer to your lodge. We recommend at least a 3 days/2 nights safari, where you can get to enjoy picnic lunches and exciting morning and evening game drives with professional game rangers in semi-open safari vehicles. During the drives you are likely to see not only the Big Five – leopard, lion, rhinoceros, elephant and buffalo but a host of other animals as well, including zebra, giraffe and many varieties of antelope. The dinners are mostly served in open-air


'Boma' (outdoor reeded enclosures) with romantic fires and lights. After the last morning game drive, transfer to the airport or airstrip for your flight to Johannesburg.

Kruger National Park


Kruger National Park is one of the world's most renowned conservation areas famous for its variety of wildlife. Kruger with its 3,000 kilometres of well-maintained roads is a relatively inexpensive way to discover South Africa's wildlife.

Accommodation: Kruger offers a range of accommodation from basic tourist rest camps to luxurious lodges, like Tinga Private Game Lodge.

Game drives: Game drives are conducted on the excellent network of tarred or gravelled roads, as off-road driving is not permitted. Clients who have booked a fly-in safari will be escorted by a ranger for morning and afternoon game drives in semi-open vehicles.







Private game reserves

The popular private game reserves of Sabi Sands, Lion Sands and Singita are close to Kruger National Park and offer excellent chances to see the Big Five.

Sabi Sabi Private Game Reserve lies on the banks of the Sabi River within one of the oldest and largest private reserves – the renowned Sabi Sand Wildtuin. Ecologically and geographically integrated within the vast Kruger National Park, home to the greatest variety of animals in any African game park, at Sabi Sabi an astounding variety of wildlife may be seen, including a wonderfully diverse selection of

mammals, reptiles, birds and amphibians, all set amidst spectacular scenery.

Accommodation: You will be provided accommodation at the Sabi Sabi -Bush Lodge – description is given on the following page.





Singita, a member of the exclusive 'Relais & Chateaux' group, is a name synonymous with opulent and exquisite luxury in a tranquil and jewel-like setting. Relax with a sun-downer amidst the peaceful stillness of the African bush. Freshen up after you return from your game drive and enjoy dinner in a cosy setting either on the dining deck or perhaps in the openair 'Boma' (outdoor reeded enclosures for dinner) next to the crackling flames of a warm log fire. The lodges also offer private plunge pools and massages on the deck of your suite or at the spa.

Accommodation: You will be provided accommodation at the Singita - Ebony Lodge – description is given on the following page.

Adjacent to the Kruger National Park lies the pristine bushveld of Lion Sands Private Game Reserve – home to some outstanding lodges, each with its own unique ambience and spirit. Abundant in bird and mammal species including the Big Five, Lion Sands provides excellent gameviewing opportunities. Between the exciting safaris, you can pamper yourself at a spa, take a moment to browse through the library, or simply relax by the pool or on your private deck with your favourite cocktail as you bask in Africa's glorious sunshine.





Port Elizabeth is the gateway to the Eastern Cape. A couple of hours drive away is an outstanding selection of private game reserves and lodges that provide for an incredible wildlife experience. You will be met by one of our representatives at the arrival hall of Port Elizabeth Airport, who will guide and transfer you to your chosen lodge.

We recommend at least a 3 days/2 nights safari.

Shamwari Game Reserve

Shamwari Game Reserve is the oldest private reserve near Port Elizabeth and is situated in verdant bush along the Bushmans River. The reserve boasts five eco-systems and supports many forms of plant, animal and bird life, including the Big Five as well as wild dog, cheetah, hyena, giraffe, hippopotamus, zebra and numerous antelope species.

Accommodation: Shamwari Game Reserve offers a range of luxury safari accommodation to compliment your safari experience and you may choose to stay at the Riverdene Lodge – description is provided on the following page.

Pumba Game Reserve

Nestled in the heart of the Eastern Cape, this hidden gem offers visitors the chance to experience Africa's incredible wildlife – from the graceful giraffe to the very rare white lions and over 300 species of birds. It is the third largest privately owned game reserve in the Eastern Cape, covering five of the seven South African natural vegetation areas, resulting in an amazing diversity of flora and fauna waiting to be discovered.



In contrast, Groot Constantia, the oldest and grandest wine estate, built in 1692, recalls a gracious way of life; and the Military Museum traces the turbulent history of the Cape.

For the family: At Simon's Town see whales, dolphins and colonies of penguins. Ratanga Junction Theme Park has more than 30 rides and attractions.

Best buys: African art and curios at Victoria & Alfred Waterfront; interesting handicrafts at Victoria Wharf Shopping Centre and Waterfront Craft Market; and large selections of designer brands.



Out and about: Victoria & Alfred Waterfront and Kloof Street are packed with restaurants and bars.

Sporting attractions: Golf, horse riding, trekking, surfing, kayaking, scuba diving, fishing and boat charters.




